## Maths Is No Problem

There are many different strategies that can be used to solve a problem. They include

- (a) Guessing and Checking
- (b) Working Backwards
- (c) Drawing a Diagram
- (d) Looking for a Pattern
- (e) Using a Table
- (f) Making a List

### Last Newsletter's Problem:

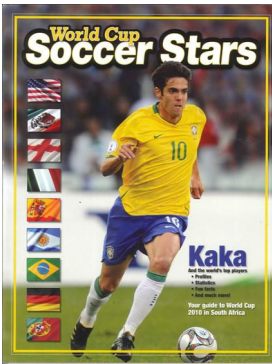
*Sally can cycle at 20 km per hour and run at 12 km per hour. She takes part in a combined cycling and running race which is over a total distance of 21 km. If she cycles for 45 minutes, how long does the complete race take her?*

**Answer:** The complete race takes Sally 75 minutes or 1¼ hours. Sally cycles at 20kph and she does this for 45 minutes, which is  $\frac{3}{4}$  of an hour. Thus she cycle a distance of  $\frac{3}{4}$  of 20km or 15km. Therefore she must run the remaining 6 km. At 12kph this will take her  $\frac{1}{2}$  hour, or 30 minutes. The whole race therefore takes her  $45 + 30 = 75$  minutes.

### Problem Solving Challenge 8:

*One wall of a house takes 4000 bricks. The second wall is twice as long but half as high as the first. The third wall is the same length as the second and has the same height as the first. The fourth wall has the same length as the second and the same height as the first. How many bricks are needed for the four walls?*

Have your child work it out; discuss it as a family, or even work together to solve it. Show **the answer** and **how the problem was solved** on a piece of paper which can be placed in the box in the School Office. The answer will appear in the next newsletter alongside the new problem to be solved.
